Integrating licensed nurses into IDF combat units significantly enhances healthcare quality, clinical decision-making, and frontline medic mentorship. These findings support expanding nurse deployment to improve overall combat readiness and warfighter care.

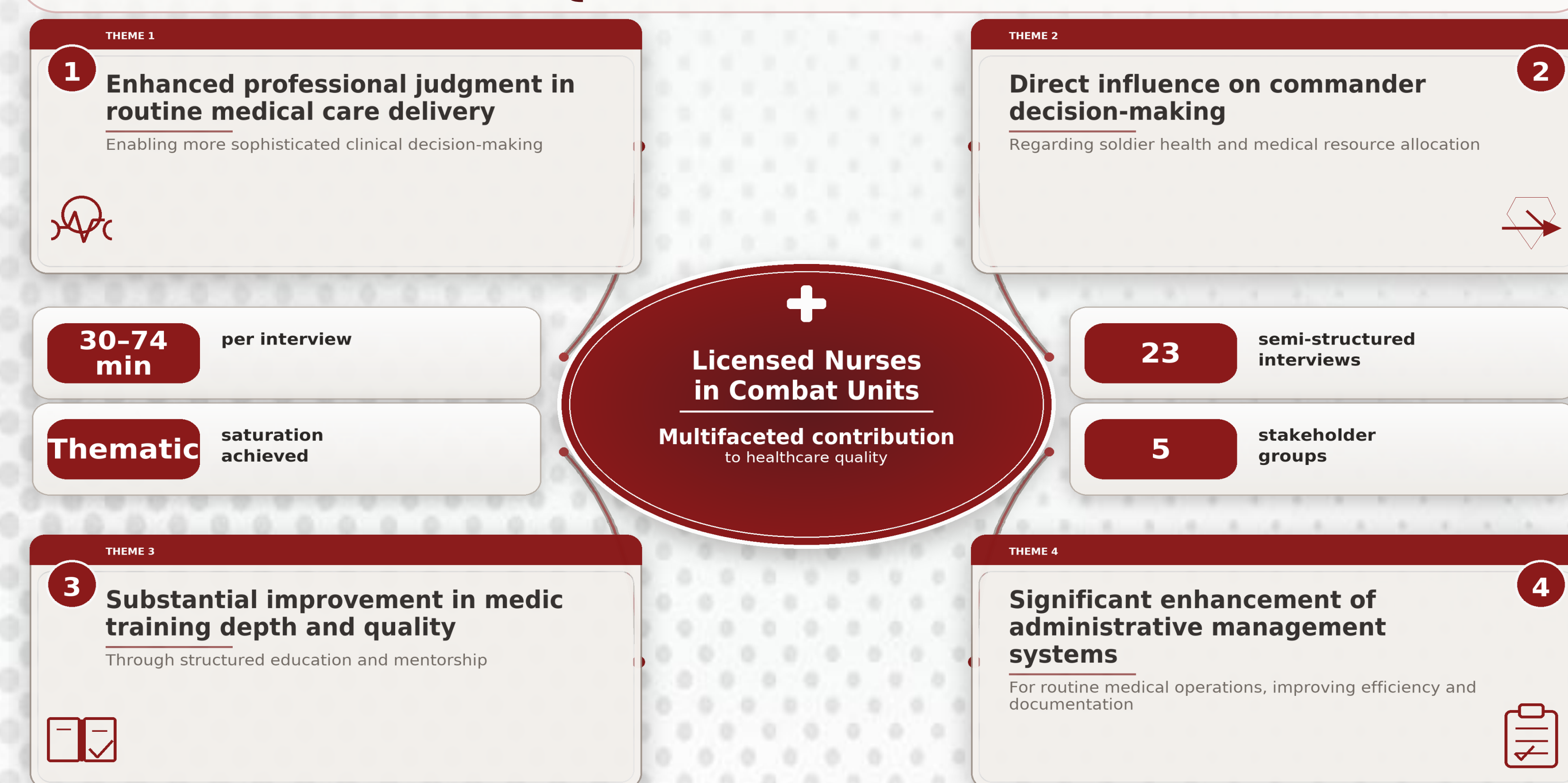
Operational learning cycle for licensed nursing integration in IDF combat units

Qualitative workflow: 23 interviews, thematic analysis, command translation, frontline adaptation



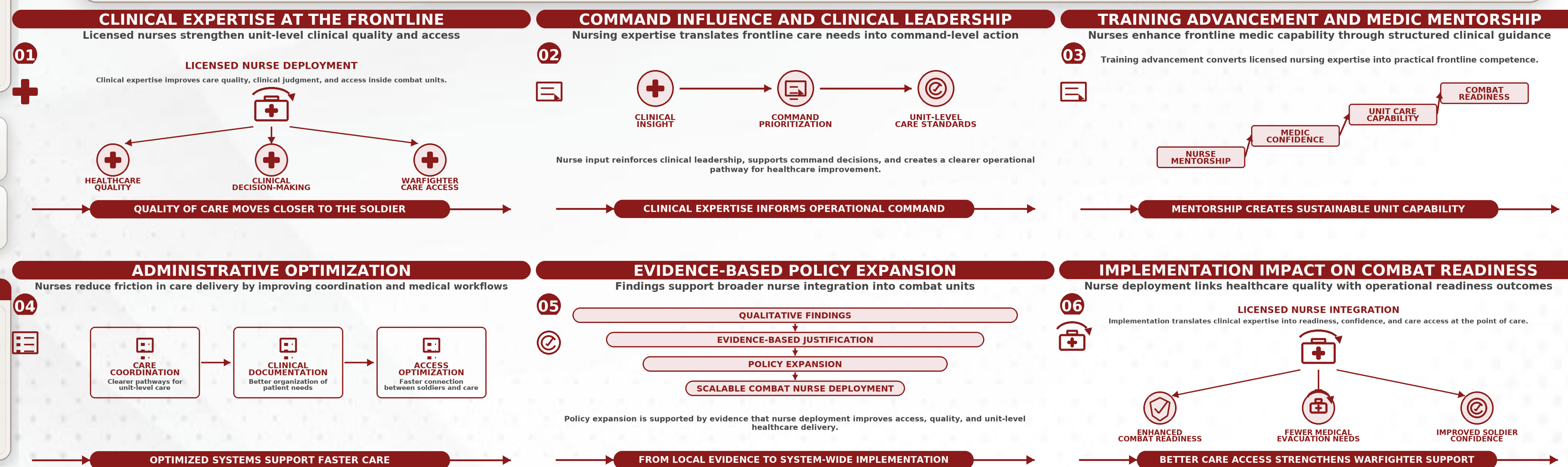
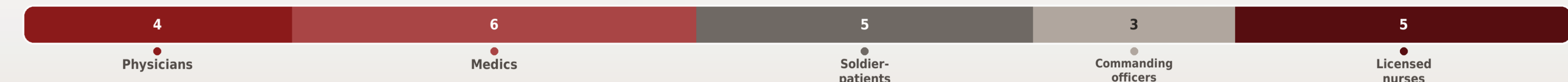
EMBEDDED CLINICAL LEARNING DURING COMBAT OPERATIONS

IMPROVING HEALTHCARE QUALITY

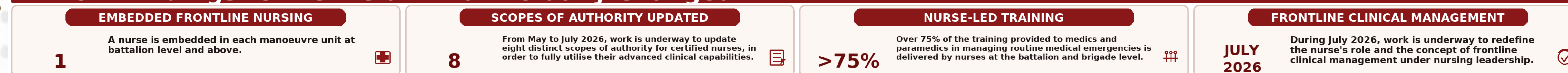
Any approach that enhances the quality of medical care, particularly in chronic disease management, staff training, accessibility, and clinical leadership, is of clear value, especially within combat units. Nurses play a central role in delivering exactly this.

SCIENTIFIC CAUTION

This study sought to characterise the contribution of nurses in IDF combat units using rigorous qualitative methods. However, causality cannot be established, and the findings were not tested against external data.
